General Information

Registration

The Grand Hotel Millennium is located in Sofia's city center, providing an excellent opportunity to attend the WG21 meetings and explore the heart of the Bulgarian capital city.

The [venue](#) offers discounted rates (breakfast included) from June 13 until June 22. A limited number of rooms are available on-site, so you'd better register early! Please use the dedicated link, which contains the discount already applied –

The number of available rooms will be limited by half after **December 15, 2024**. Please book beforehand to guarantee a discounted stay. Please note that the discounted booking link will be open **until April 14, 2025**. Still, we can not guarantee room availability after December 15, 2024.

Several other hotels are within walking distance, but the Millennium is the most convenient option since the meeting will be held there.

Currency

Bulgaria is not yet part of the eurozone and most places work only with the local Bulgarian currency lev/ leva / BGN. The conversion rate to the EUR is fixed and 1 EUR is roughly 2 leva. In most places in Sofia, you can pay with a credit card, but we advise you to ask in advance whether credit card payments are accepted. It would be handy to have a small amount of local

currency. Next to the hotel, there's a bank offering currency exchange services, along with an available ATM. Banks and ATMs can also be found at the airport. [Read more.](#)

Visa

Since January 1, 2007, the Republic of Bulgaria has been applying the European Union's Common Visa Policy, subject to the terms of the Accession Treaty. Bulgaria has recently become a Schengen member, and the EU internal air and sea border checks have been lifted which means that there are no additional checks for visitors coming by air from another Schengen member country in Europe. Transport

Getting to Sofia

Sofia is easily accessible via Sofia International Airport (SOF), located just 10 km from the city center. Taxis, hotel shuttles, and public transportation (metro and buses) are available to reach your destination. The airport is serviced by numerous international airlines, ensuring convenient flight options from most major cities in Europe.

SOF Terminal 2 is metro-serviced and transportation from Terminal 1 to Terminal 2 is free of charge. Taxis are affordable and we advise you to use a taxi service from the official partner of Sofia Airport (currently it is Yellow Taxi). You will find a taxi queue around the corner to the right as you walk out of the airport. Avoid accepting occasional taxi ride offers at the airport as they are usually 5-10 times more expensive. Before you depart, **install the Google Translate app** on your mobile phone and download the Bulgarian language database. The camera-based instant translations are super helpful for restaurant menus and the like. Still, it is good to know that most young Sofia citizens speak English well.
