#### 2.0 Advisory subgroup status reports

• Meeting logistics: Jens Maurer

• **DG**, Direction group: Michael Wong

We planned to issue a new edition of P2000, but it was delayed due to long discussions on Safety/Security, and the recent Convenor re-election where we have been looking carefully at the exact rules to ensure that the election is fair and uncontested. We have inducted 2 additional members and we are all actively engaging with members to improve the function of the DG.

• ARG, ABI review group: Daveed Vandevoorde, Jason Merrill

#### 2.1 Pipeline stage 1 groups: Specialist subgroup status reports (Sgs)

SGs 2, 3, 5, 8, 11, 12, and 13 are currently dormant and handled in the main subgroups. The active SGs are:

• SG1, Concurrency: Olivier Giroux, Hans Boehm, Ruslan Arutyunyan

SG1 did not meet between meetings.

We will meet in Kona to discuss NB body comments and several papers. Olivier isn't going to be there, Ruslan and Gonzalo will be running things.

SG1 to coordinate room assignment with Jens.

• SG4, Networking: Jeff Snyder, Gašper Ažman

We don't have any papers for Kona. We will not be meeting in Kona.

• SG5, Transactional Memory: Hans Boehm

SG5 is waiting for the last bits of update to the transactional memory whitepaper, which should hopefully be ready for Kona.

• SG6, Numerics: Matthias Kretz, Lisa Lippincott, John McFarlane

SG6 "Numerics" has 11 papers and one LWG issue to review. 1.5 days might provide enough time to get through, but we will need to see about quorum and how long Lisa can run the room (with Matthias being remote).

• SG7, Compile-time programming: Hana Dusíková, Jeff Snyder

Hana Dusíková report : SG7 hasn't met since Sofia. We will meet at Kona (hopefully Wednesday morning) and I will be remote, but my awesome co-chair will be on site. We will be doing C++29 papers. Any Reflection NB comments should be handled in EWG or LEWG. Unless we will be asked to provide expert feedback.

• SG9, Ranges : Jonathan Müller, Zach Laine

SG9 (Ranges) has not met since Sofia. We have four C++26 NB comments we need to make recommendations on and will then move on to papers targeting C++29 (unless LEWG requires more feedback of course).

• SG10, Feature test: Barry Revzin, Jonathan Wakely

We will try to update the features test document for Kona before the meeting.

• SG14, Low latency: Michael Wong

We continue to meet monthly. We met at CppCon in conjunction with SG19 AI to induct new memberships and examine floating points. We also have been reviewing an omnibus paper on Games features. Our next meeting will be in December.

• SG15, Tooling: Michael Spencer, Ben Boeckel

We haven't met since Sofia. We are likely to meet in Kona, but unsure for how long.

• SG16, Unicode: Tom Honermann, Steve Downey

SG16 continues to meet approximately twice monthly. As usual, SG16 will not meet during Kona so as not to contribute to quorum challenges. I will be attending Kona remotely.

SG16 will meet one more time before the Kona meeting, on 2025-10-22, in order to form a recommendation for the following two NB comments.

- <u>US 5-018</u>: 5 [lex] Define "whitespace character"

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SG16 provided recommendations for the following NB comments during its 2025-10-08 meeting.

- US 8-021: 5.5p1 [lex.pptoken] Allow skipping non-preprocessing tokens via #if
- <u>CA-022</u>: 5.5p1 [lex.pptoken] Add example for ill-formed non-preprocessing tokens
- <u>US 63-115</u>: 16.3.3.3.4.1p01.2 [character.seq.general] Move [character.seq.general] to the core wording

SG16 has met 7 times since the Sofia pre-meeting admin telecon on 2025-06-02 and has reviewed the following issues and papers.

- <u>CWG2843</u>: Undated reference to Unicode makes C++ a moving target.
- <u>LWG4070</u>: Transcoding by std::formatter<std::filesystem::path>.
- <u>LWG4090</u>: Underspecified use of locale facets for locale-dependent std::format.
- <u>P2843R2</u>: Preprocessing is never undefined.
- <u>P3677R0</u>: Preserving LC\_CTYPE at program start for UTF-8 locales.
- <u>P3681R0</u>: char traits: Stop the bleeding!
- <u>P3695R1</u>: Deprecate implicit conversions between Unicode character types.
- <u>P3733R0</u>: More named universal character escapes.

We still have not made progress towards publishing proper public SG16 minutes, but rough minutes continue to be posted to the WG21 wiki.

As always, there is no shortage of work ahead of us.

• SG17, EWG incubator: Erich Keane, James Touton

SG17, the Evolution Incubator will not be meeting during the Kona meeting. EWGI had a vast majority of its papers seen in EWG in Sofia, so has few papers, however the most pressing reason is a lack of available chairs.

• SG18, LEWG incubator: Billy Baker, Nevin Liber

SG18, Library Evolution Incubator, will not be meeting in Kona. SG18 chairs will be assisting in LEWG.

Since we are not meeting, SG1 has been asked to look at <u>P3832R0</u> Timed lock algorithms for multiple lockables.

• SG19, Machine learning: Michael Wong, Phil Ratzloff

We continue to meet monthly. We met at CppCon in conjunction with SG14 Low latency to induct new memberships and examine Statistics. We also have been reviewing a Graph paper. We plan to expand our list when we have more bandwidth to include LLM and Data mechanisms. Our next meeting will be in December.

We won't be meeting in Kona.

• SG20, Education: JC van Winkel, Florian Sattler

SG20 will not meet in Kona.

SG20 has met once since Kona, providing paper feedback and approving 2 new teaching topics, and provided feedback to various in-the-works topics, steadily adding more topics to our education guidelines at https://github.com/cplusplus/SG20.

Apart from authoring these teaching guidelines, we have also given feedback to a paper author, and would like to encourage paper authors to run their proposals by SG20 for suggestions regarding teachability.

• SG21, Contracts: John Spicer, Timur Doumler

SG21 (Contracts) as the study group has now been made dormant; all Contracts-related matters should go directly to EWG.

• SG22, C/C++ liaison: Nina Ranns, JeanHeyd Meneide, Davis Herring

SG22 met once since Sofia to discuss:

P3540 R2 #embed Parameter offset

### 2.2 Pipeline stage 2 groups: Design subgroup status reports

• EWG, Core evolution: JF Bastien, Hana Dusíková, Erich Keane

EWG will meet all week with a tricky chair situation: I will be there Monday/Tuesday, Erich and Jeff will be there all week, and Hana will be remote.

We have <u>60 NB comments currently assigned to EWG</u>, 26 of which are related to contracts, 5 reflection, 10 trivial relocation. We expect to spend a significant portion of the week on NB comments, including supporting other WG/SG requests. We've asked NBs for their input regarding scheduling for contracts in particular to make sure that individuals who file comments can be heard, and will soon publish a schedule. We expect to spend 2 days on contracts (Monday and Tuesday).

We will be seeing some papers tied to NB comments. Papers not related to NB comments will be seen time permitting. There are currently 55 papers assigned to EWG and ready to be seen.

• LEWG, Library evolution: Inbal Levi, Fabio Fracassi, Andreas Weis

Inbal Levi reports: I will be in Kona, and Nevin and Billy will be co-chairing, with additional assistance from Fabio and Andreas remotely.

LEWG have run 9 telecons since Sofia, and seen the following papers:

- P3778R0: Fix for type order template definition
- P3707R0: A std::is always exhaustive trait
- P3774R0: Rename std::nontype, and make it broadly useful (follow-up on P3740R0 seen during Sofia)
- P3794R0: An idea or two on renaming the nontype tag
- P3801R0: Concerns about the design of std::execution::task
- P3796R1: Coroutine Task Issues
- Issues Repo
- P3818R1: constexpr exception fix for potentially constant initialization (fix for 26)
- P3820R1: Fix constexpr uncaught exceptions and current exception (fix for 26)
- P3798R1: The unexpected in std::expected (C++29)
- P3505R1: Fix the default floating-point representation in std::format

We have forwarded 2 papers for C++29 by electronic poll (the rest have NB comments for them, so we only gave feedback).

### 2.3 Pipeline stage 3 groups: Wording subgroup status reports

• CWG, Core wording: Jens Maurer, Jason Merrill, Jonathan Caves

CWG will focus on NB comments during the week in Kona.

There are currently 57 of such assigned to CWG; most of them will be handled via the issues process, but the ones with larger scope will need volunteers to write papers.

Additional work is expected to arrive from EWG's processing of their comments.

• LWG, Library wording: Jonathan Wakely, Jeff Garland, Dietmar Kühl, Bryan St. Amour, Christian Trott

LWG expects to spend all of the Kona meeting working on NB comments, related issues, and papers. We've already been processing NB comments in telecom, so far accepting 16 and rejecting 1, turning a couple into editorial changes and dispatching some to LEWG. We will have one more session before Kona. Currently there are 95 more issues to triage and we expect more to come from LEWG as they process their issues.

Due to the point in the cycle we will be moving all issues to 'immediate' instead of providing the usual one meeting courtesy period for review.

### 2.4 SC22 report

We have a new WG21 convener - Guy Davidson. Thank you to everyone who volunteered. We will have a convenership team going forward (Guy Davidson, Jeff Garland, and Nina Ranns).
