Graz: Graz is the second largest city in Austria with a population of 300.000 and is the capital of the federal state of Styria at the eastern edge of the Alps. Graz is located about 150 km southwest of Vienna at the river Mur and close to the border to Slovenia. Graz is a university city with four universities and several universities of applied sciences (60.000 students). The city center and Eggenberg Palace are listed as UNESCO World Heritage Site.

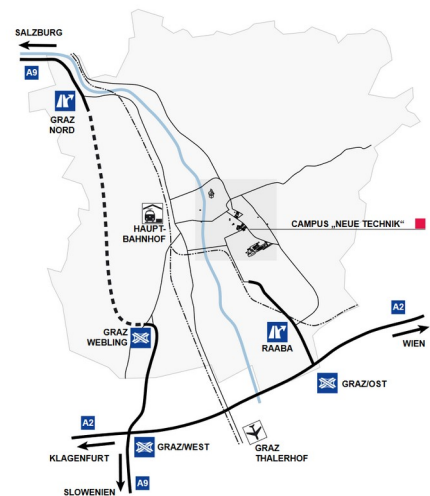
Meeting dates: February 24 to February 28

Nearest airports: Graz airport (GRZ) is a small regional airport 10 km south of the city center and offers connecting flights to international transit hubs such as Vienna, Frankfurt, Munich, London, etc. It is connected to Graz via S-Bahn S5 to Graz main station (20 minutes).
